I n d e p e n d Alabama's local Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs) and other community partners have expanded their services and are now providing information, assistance and services through their Aging and Disability Resource Centers.

What is an Aging & Disability Resource Center?

- A local community's one stop access point for information and services to help people, adults with disabilities and caregivers find the resources they need regardless of their income.
- A visible and trusted place in the community where you can get free information, counseling and access to a wide variety of services and programs.
- A single point-of-entry to public longterm services and supports to make informed decisions and provide streamlined access to those services.
- A partnership between agencies to assist consumers and provide follow-up to ensure access to services.

Information and Assistance

ADRC Specialists provide you with knowledge about services, programs, and solutions for disability and long-term care issues such as living arrangements, health, adult protective services, employment and training for people with disabilities, home maintenance, nutrition, Social Security, and other publicly funded programs.

Benefits Counseling

ADRC Specialists can provide accurate and current information about private and public benefits or programs that you may qualify to receive. ADRC Specialists will help navigate issues when people run into problems with Medicare, Social Security and other benefits.

Options Counseling

ADRC Specialists offer information about the choices that are available to meet your long-term services and supports. An ADRC Specialist discusses factors to consider when making long-term care decisions so you have the knowledge and information you need to make an informed decision.

Health and Wellness

Today there are many ways that someone can stay healthy and avoid injury even if a person is getting older or living with a disability. ADRC Specialists can make connections for you that will support your best possible health and safety.

Planning for Future Needs

ADRCs are the entry-way to publicly funded long-term services and supports.

ADRC Specialists will help assess your level of need for services and ensure that you are eligible. Counselors can provide information about all the options available and help you select the solution best for you.

Crisis Support

If you or someone you know is at risk of abuse or neglect, losing housing or heat, ADRC Specialists are there to help connect you with someone who will respond to your urgent situation.
